- **Cutting Plant** for cutting and storage in temperature controlled conditions of meat from:
 - Domestic ungulates
 - Farmed birds and lagomorphs
 - Large wild game
- **Minced Meat Establishment** for the production of **minced meat**
- **Meat Preparations Establishment** for the production of **meat preparations**

- **Re-wrapping Establishment** for the Re-wrapping of products of animal origin (fresh or processed)
- **Repackaging Establishment** for the Repackaging of products of animal origin (fresh or processed)
- **Cold store** for the storage of **Products of Animal Origin** brought into your establishment.

The approved establishment comprises all those buildings, rooms and areas within the boundary outlined in red on the approved site plan.
